



I also found people engaged in the following technologies and or sciences: alchemy, astronomy, medicine, weaving, glass manufacture, milling of grain, metallurgy, leatherworking, architecture, manufacture of parchment and paper, etc. In fact, I was impressed with the diversity of applied sciences and thought others might like to see some illustrations of period technologhy.

Perhaps you have some illustrations showing examples of the applied sciences that could be shared with the Barony. We would be glad to publish them or other drawings, articles, etc.




65 Between a mathematician and a computist sits an astronomer. In one hand he holds an astrolabe (for calculating the elevation of the stars), in the other an early telescope



Furnace and stills designed by Leonardo da Vinci




Nicole Oresme's armillary sphere


Battle of Morat, 1476, between Burgundy and Lorraine.
