Canadian members must add the First Class option to their subscriptions to any publication, including their own Kingdom newsletter, as Canada does not honor our Third Class mailing permit. Please send U.S. dollars only—it costs us a great deal to process Canadian funds.

All officers of the SCA must be members in good standing.

PATRON: \$150/year. Member receives, if requested, all Kingdom newsletters at Third Class postage (\$6/year each), Tournaments Illuminated (\$4/year), the Minutes of the Board of Directors (\$6/year), The Compleat Anachronist (\$6/year), a membership card, and the extreme gratitude of the Society. Influential People of Period

The Influence of Nicolaus Copernicus

The great Polish astronomer Nicolaus Copernicus (Polish name: Mikolaj Kopernik) was born in 1473 in the city of Torun on the Vistula River in Poland. He came fram a well-to-do family. As a young man he study at the University of Cracow, where he first became interested in astronomy. While in his mid-twenties he went to Italy to study law and medicine at the University of Bologna and Padua, and later recieved a Doctorate in canon law from the University of Ferrara. Most of his adult life was spent on the staff of the cathedral at Frauenburg where he was canon. He was never a professional astronomer, and the great work which made him famous was accomplished in his spare time. During his stay in Italy, he had become aquainted with the idea of the 3rd century Greek philosopher, Aristarchus of Samos, that the earth and other planets revolve around the sun. Copernicus became convinced of the correctness of this hypothesis and when at about the age of forty he began to circulate amoung his friends a short, handwritten manuscript setting forth in preliminary form his own idea on the subject. He has spent many years taking the necessary observations and making calculations that were required for the composition of his great book, " On the Revolution of the Great Celestial Spheres), in which he describes his theory in detail and sets forth the evidence for it. In 1533 when he was sixty years old, he delivered a series of luctures in Rome, in which he presented the principle points of his theory and did so without incurring papal disapproval. Nevertheless, even when his book was completed, he hesitated to publish it for fear of difficulties with the Church. When he was nearly seventy years old he finally decided to have the book published, and it was almost to late he recieved the first copy of the book on the same day he died. Why does Copernicus deserve a place as an influential person of period. It is clear that the Copernican theory has revolutionized our conception of the universe, and this has led to major changes in our whole philosophical outlook. The direct influence on his theory is often overlooked. Without this indispensable book both Galileo and Kepler might have never been able to put forth their own ideas and Newton, whose dicoveries could not have been made without the work done by those two, would not have been able to formulate the laws of motion and gravitation, the historic starting point for modern science.
