Changelings X(?) Feb. 28 Holy Family Seminary

Coronation of William and Mammara March 14 Forgotten Sea (Kansas City)

Activities include a tourney, several competitions, a 5 course feast, and (of course) Coronation court.
The tourney will be held outdoors if weather permits; in case

it doesn't, fighters should bring soft shoes. The new fighter ID/Authorization cards will be REQUIRED to participate in the tourney. Arts and Science competitions will include Lace-making, Leather Embellishment, Middle Eastern Costume, Middle Eastern Dance, Bohemian Costume, Bohemian Dance, and an Eistedfodd (ask Mistress Luciana what that means--it's some special sort of performing arts contest).

The feast is being done by Lady Susannah Griffon, and will include breads, cheese, veggies, and fruit; French onion soup; roast beef and trimmings; Cornish game hens and rice pilaf; and a surprise dessert.

Fees: Site fee \$2.50; feast fee \$6.50, or \$7.50 after this Sunday (feast fee does not include site fee). Knock a buck off the site fee with proof of membership. Further info in the MEWS.

Dance Seminar Mar. 14 Jararvellir (Madison, Wis.)

For those who don't like Lady Susannah's cooking, I guess. There is a dance workshop during the day followed by (I'm not making this up) a "Saturday Knight Fever" and dessert revel. There are ten different sessions during the day's dance workshop; the evening flyer advertises live music, dance cards, hot apple cider, and medieval cookies. You'll have to dig out a January PALE for the registration form, and the February PALE for other info.

Baron's Birthday Ceilidh Mar. 21 Dun Ard (Leavenworth, Kans.)

This is the third annual Ceilidh (celebration of dance) in honor of the birthday of Baron Charles Stewart O'Connor (although it's the first one to be held in Dun Ard). There will be dance instruction during the day; dancing in the evening, and Celtic-style entertainment (harps, singing, eatkilling bagpipes, etc.) much of the time. In the evening there will be a Bardic Circle devoted to Celtic themes; Baron Charles will award a prize for the best researched and delivered tale from the legends and lore of Ireland, Scotland, and/or Wales.

The dance instruction is limited to 60 people, so reservations must be made in advance! Crash space is available on site after 7:00 Friday evening. See the MEWS for more information.

This is a feast in celebration of the Vernal Equinox, including a double elim tourney, contests for the most courteous fighter, the best original love ballad, and the best favor, a quest, and a simple Irish meal. (No, that's "meal," not "mead.") More information is in the PALE.

Calontir Herald's Symposium Mar. 28 Three Rivers (right here)

Anyone interested in heraldry is invited. Discussions will cover the areas of procedural policies, heraldic displays, the future of heraldry in Calontir, and suchlike. Kingdom Dance Workshop April 4 Axed Root (Ames, Ia.)

Classes during the day, masked ball with live music in the

evening, potluck feast in between. Game Judges will be working with Contessa Merriem

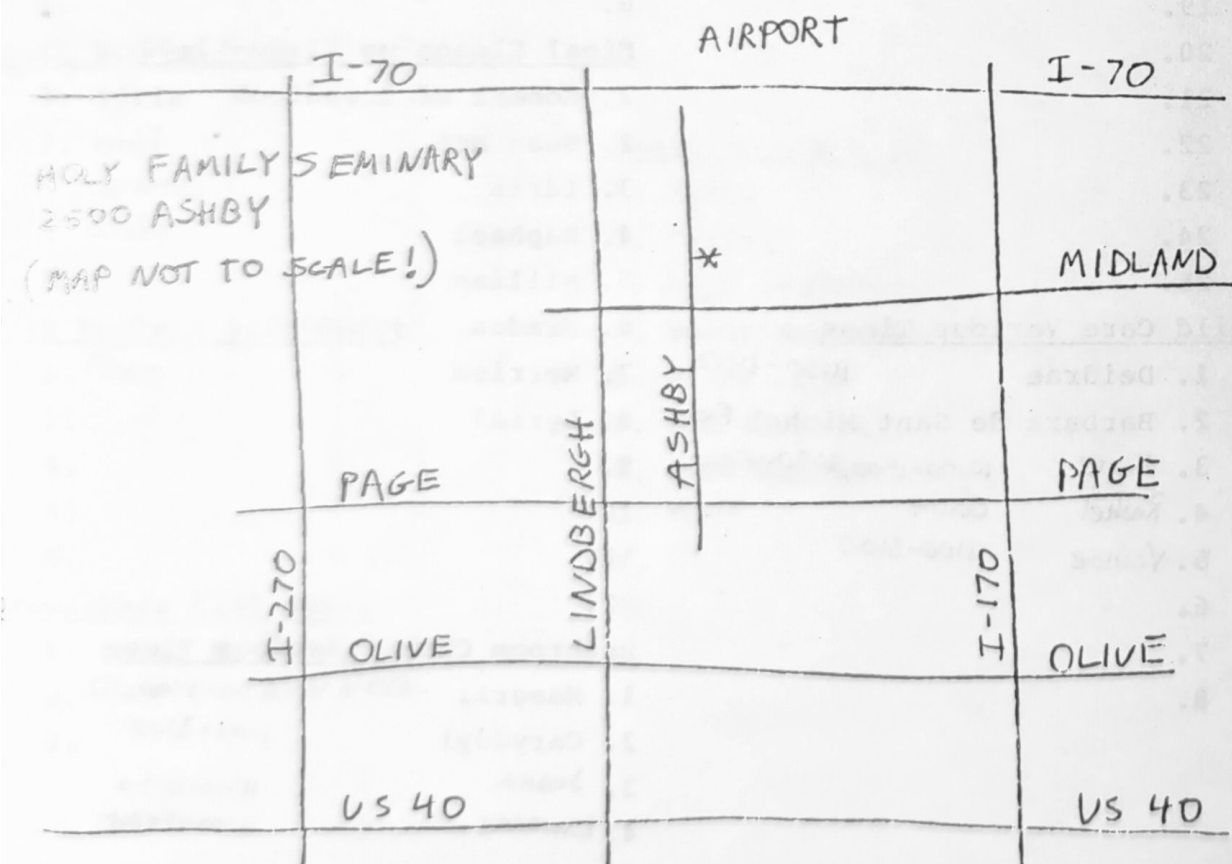
