

From the Seneschal

On Demos:

Recently we have experienced a dramatic increase in the number of demo requests received by the Barony. Many are the result of a demo done for Boy Scout leaders last December. The scouts have mainly requested our participation at their "Blue and Gold" banquets. In addition, we have requests for demos from schools, church groups and even a fraternity. We are presently in contact with the St. Charles Visitors Bureau, discussing our participation in a Renaissance Street Fair scheduled for mid-April; this would be a recruitment demo as well as an educational demo.

Demos for this year (so far): January 1, February 6, March 2, April 5, tentative dates in June and July. As you can see, we are quite busy and I'm sure we will be receiving more demo requests since one demo usually spawns several more.

If you receive a request for a demo by the Barony, have them contact the seneschal by mail or farspeaker. Though only the seneschal can make any commitments for the Barony or the SCA, you can explain the SCA to them and present to them some of the possible activities that we can provide at a demo. You should advise them that Thursday evenings are not available and that Friday evenings and weekends would be difficult. Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday evenings are the best times.

Any member of the Barony can participate in a demo. Demos can have one specific activity or a wide variety of activities, such as fighting, dancing, calligraphy, leather work, embroidery, heraldry, etc. At fighting demos there are things for non-fighters to do such as constabling, helping the fighters armour, assisting with the weapons and armour lecture, or giving pointers to the youngsters so they can clobber your friends in "whack-a-knight". You might like to do a little studying and prepare a brief talk on some aspect of medieval arts, sciences or everyday life. These brief lectures are very useful when we do demos for schools.

At recent evening demos we have been adjourning to a nearby pizza parlor or restaurant for a mini post-revel, which have been great fun.

Come join us at a demo, because we can always find something for you to do, and you'll have a good time too.

- 25 subscriptions X 12 months left X price per issue .35 = 105.00


