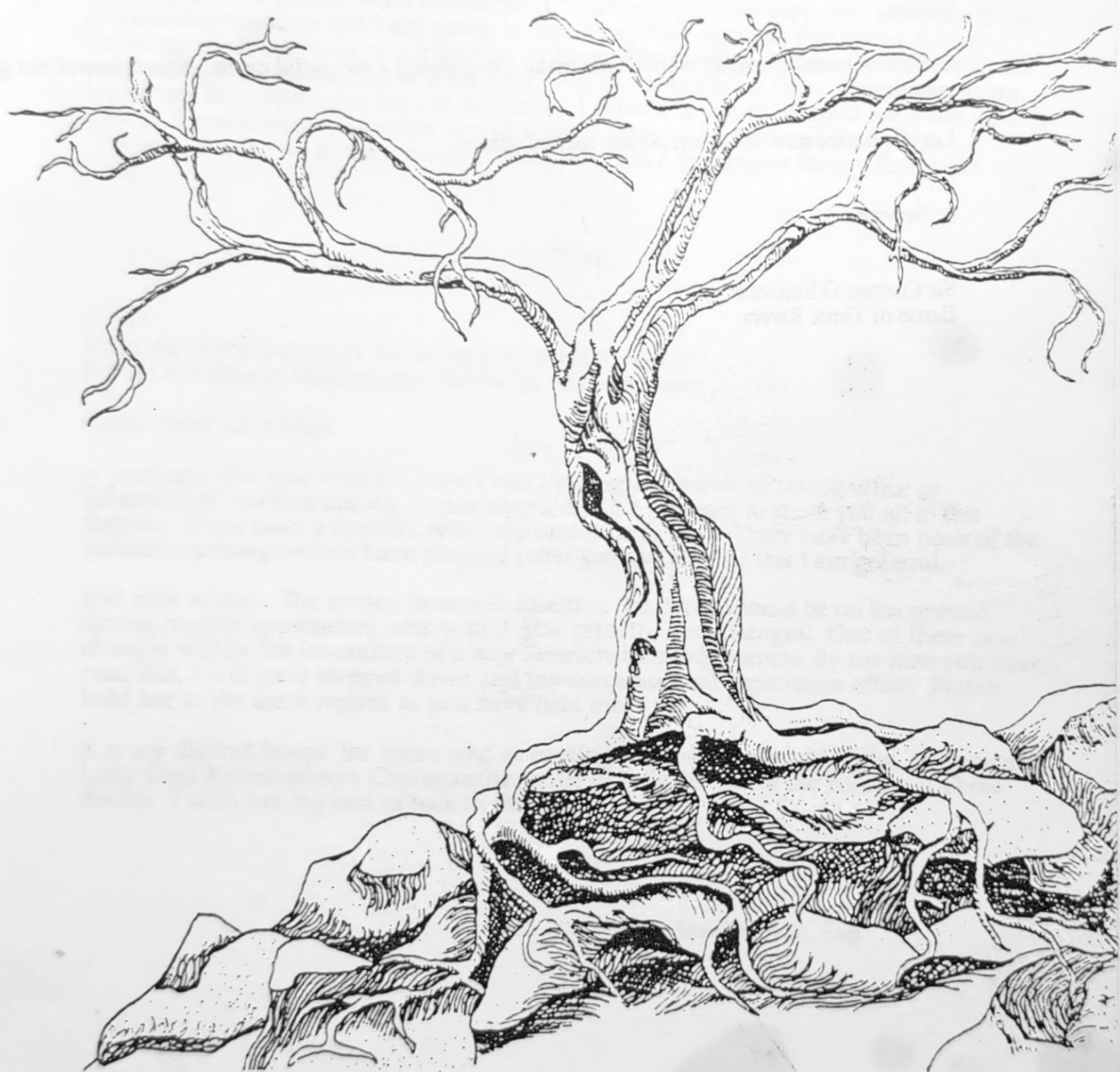


THE BARGE

HISTORIC HIGHLIGHTS FOR MARCH

- March 4, 1461 - Edward IV is proclaimed King of England by the Yorkist peers, merchants and commons of London.
- March 18, 1241 - Near the town of Chmielnik, in central Poland, Mongol forces led by Baidar (son of Chagatai) ambushed and destroyed a Polish army under Vladimir, the Palatine of Sandomir and Cracow.
- March 24, 1241 - The Polish city of Cracow is burned by the Mongols, under Baidar and Prince Kadan, after being abandoned by the fleeing Poles.
- March 25, 1306 - Robert the Bruce is crowned as Robert I of Scotland.
- March 29, 1461 - Battle of Towton: The Yorkist army under Edward IV engaged Margaret of Anjou's Lancastrian army near the town of Towton. The battle raged through a snowstorm from 9:00 am till near 3:00 pm. The Lancastrians' attack began to ebb when one of their senior commanders, Lord Dacres, was killed, and as the Duke of Norfolk reinforced the Yorkist right flank with several thousand fresh troops. The Lancastrians were beginning to withdraw, when suddenly their whole line collapsed, leading to a Yorkist victory.

The Battle of Towton was one of the bloodiest in English history, on English soil, with the loss of 12,000 Yorkist and 20,000 Lancastrians. It was also one of the most decisive battles of the war, firmly establishing Edward IV on the throne. Henry VI, Margaret of Anjou, and their son, Edward, fled to Scotland following the battle.

These historic highlights were brought to you courtesy of Viscount Brumbar von Schwartzburg, Master of Chivalry, Master of the Pelican. Look for more next month.

These individuals do not need to know much about accounting, as the books can be easily explained, however they do need to be able to use a calculator to add and subtract. If you are interested, please speak to me as soon as possible.

- I b) Cash Earning Interest: This includes all the money we have in the bank, regardless of whether or not the funds have been previously allocated for a specific use.
- I d) Inventory For Sale: T-Shirts.
- I e) Regalia: Baronial Thrones and Trappings, Mass Weapon's Tourney Mace.
- I f) Property and Equipment: Archery Targets, Carousel list ropes, poles, and banners.
- I g) Minus Accum. Depreciation: Official wear and tear on the above.
- II c) Liabilities: Money held for Kingdom Brewers Guild.

Page 2

- 1) Direct Contributions: Mostly from Demos.
- 2) Program Service Income: Event income before expenses.
- 5 a) Income Sale of Inventory: T-Shirts
- 7 a) Funds Received From Within the Kingdom: 3 Checks received by Canton of Riverhold with the Barony's name instead of the Canton's.
- 14 M&G) Equip Rental & Maint: Moving the armoring equipment, Repair and painting of baronial arms on Baron Cormac's shield.
- 21 M&G) Other Expenses: Removing road signs from equipment list where they did not belong. (Only items costing more than 100.00 belong there.), Correction to value of inventory, Correction to 1990 Domesday, Correction to balance books with checking accounts.
- 23 M&G) Depreciation: This years official wear and tear on equipment owned by the Barony.


