Creating an SCA Wardrobe: A Practical Guide to Making Medieval Clothing for Yourself and Others

I am writing this series of articles to provide basics for the beginning sewer, as well as give new ideas to the experienced ones. In this series, I will try to provide tips on research, buying fabric, sewing hints, and some of my personal philosophy on sewing medieval clothes. I hope you will enjoy them and maybe even use some of the ideas presented. I will also take requests for discussion topics in future articles for the Barge. These can be about specific clothing styles, how to use handsewing techniques, clothing embellishment, etc.

Why Make Medieval Clothing?

When you come into the SCA, one look around the room will tell you that the people who are wearing the "funny clothes" are the ones who are actively involved with what's going on. You feel different and out of place in street clothing. What's your next step in becoming more a part of things? The answer: getting your own medieval clothing. But how? Why? What do I get? These are the questions that I'll begin to answer.


"Why?" is simple. We are a group that researches and recreates the medieval time period. When we present ourselves to others at demonstrations and events, our greatest need as a living history group is to keep up our appearance as medieval people. This is one reason why I try not to use the words costume and garb when teaching a class or in my writing. Call me what you will, but the whole premise of our group is that we become our medieval selves when we participate in SCA activities. As these people, we work, play, eat, and sleep at events in these garments. That qualifies them as clothes, not costumes.

"How do I get them?" requires a small amount of conversation and legwork. First, (if you're a new member) you find the group's chatelaine (the new member greeter) or the Minister of Arts. It is the responsibility of these officers to talk to members and introduce them to people who can help them get more involved in the group. Most importantly, they know who can help you make or buy clothing. They will either give you the telephone numbers of or even personally introduce you to people who can help you. What a great way to meet new people and make new friends. In some smaller SCA groups, it is traditional for someone to make a "first tunic" and present it to a new member. Think of all the good feelings these simple acts of kindness bring.

Once you have met some of the group's clothiers, you brain will probably be swamped with ideas, questions, and more information than you probably cared to know. We clothiers like to talk and share our research and ideas. Don't be overwhelmed because, along with all the information, usually comes an invitation to come for a sewing session at their home. You will probably be given some questions to look into, including "What type of clothing do you want?" and "What country and time period do you want to be from?". If these questions befuddle you, the solution lies in that mysterious building called The Library

If you're lucky, your group or your seamstress will have a collection of books for you to go through and collect your ideas. The best books to look through are art books and historical clothing books (usually found in the costume section) which have a lot of pictures of paintings, sculptures, and actual clothing examples in them. These will give you some idea of the basic styles worn throughout the SCA time period (650 A.D.-1600 A.D.). When you find something you like, make photocopies, take them to your clothier, and talk about your findings. What you have just done is considered to be basic clothing research!

"What do I do next?" is a question easily answered by your clothier. Pull out that photocopy of the manuscript figure from 1150 A.D., wearing a knee-length blue tunic with long sleeves that are narrowed at the wrists, and say "I want to make this to wear at the next Baronial court.". Your clothier will then help you choose the fabric, make the pattern, and create the clothing. You will then have new clothing to show off, as well as the ability to tell admirers a little bit about the outfit and how it was made.

Axe Throwing - Even more simple??? accuracy test.






