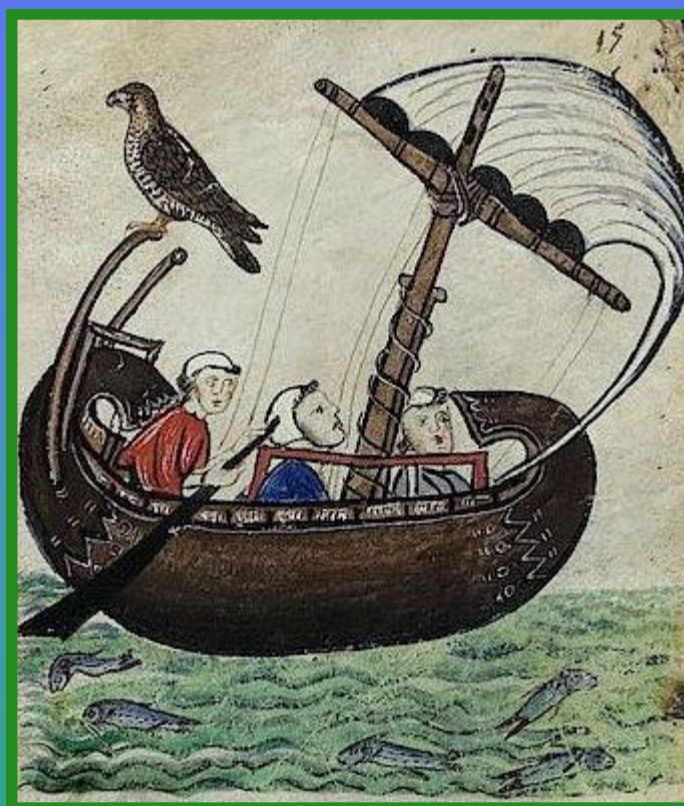
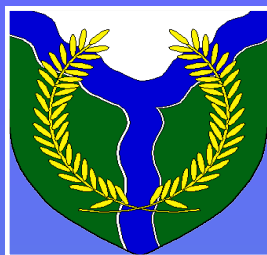

Greetings!

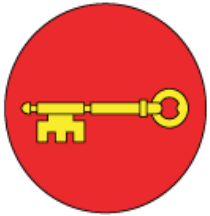

WHAT IS “QUEEN’S PRIZE TOURNAMENT”?



On September 17th, in the Barony of Coeur d’Ennui (Des Moines, IA), Calontir will hold the annual Queen’s Prize Tournament. Many of our newer folk may have heard about this, and be wondering what it is. To begin with, the word “Tournament” is something of a misnomer. Yes, there is a winner of the “Queen’s Choice” prize. But it is so much more than just that one choice. It is a chance for the artisans of the kingdom to present their work and to receive feedback, guidance, and encouragement from those who specialize in that kind of endeavor.

“But...how does it work?” I’m so glad you asked that! Entrants can have no *higher* A&S award than a Golden Calon Swan or a Leather Mallet. Entrants who have received no award of any kind are encouraged to enter! Each entrant must be sponsored by someone who is a member of a GoA level Order (Calon Lily or Silver Hammer, or the equivalent from another kingdom), or by a Laurel. A registration, with the description of your entry and the name of your sponsor must be submitted by August 31st. In addition to the prize given by the Queen, there is also a “Judges Choice” prize, which is, typically, a basket of assorted items contributed by the judges. Also, each entrant receives a gift, given by one of the sponsors.

Isen and I are willing to teach any of the glass techniques that I know (stained glass, lampworking, enameling, etc.). Everyone is welcome, however a call or email beforehand if you are coming would be appreciated (especially if I know what you want to work on- I can have those tools/materials ready). Fees for materials- will be charged based on projects chosen & materials used. If you have your own tools/material, they are more than welcome. I should have most stuff people will want to use, but odd requests (like gold, boro glass, dichroic glass, etc.) will most likely have to be ordered & will take time. Please bring a pair of sturdy shoes (no sandals or flip-flops). Also, please wear clothes that can get dirty/torn/burned etc.



Weaving Wednesday



Anyone is welcome! Bring your weaving; ideas and/or questions that you have about weaving; or your interest in other fiber arts. My warping board is currently free should someone want/need to use one. I have a couple of weaving projects that I might be working on or another fiber project. I have a couple of ridged heddle looms for loan. There is a 4-shaft table loom (with stand) and a floor loom, that are available to rent. There is also a warping board that can be used here, if you need to use one.

I have many books on weaving (some on spinning, as well as felting) that you are welcome to look at. You're welcome to browse through our books on the fiber arts (or any of our other books - other crafts/artwork; history (Norse); archaeological information, etc.).

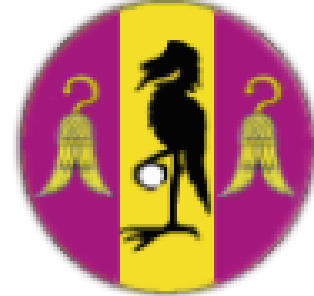
There will be something to drink, usually either hot or cold tea. If you need my address, please either call (314) 651-3459 or PM me for my address.
