Thíngs I've learned about having children and teens in the SCA.



- 1. If I don't make the effort to remember to call them by their SCA names, no one else is going to, either
- 2. If I have to choose between a little girl in a plastic tiara and a "magic" wand, who is smiling and having a ball, and a perfectly garbed little girl who is miserable,...I'll take smiling ANYTIME.
- 3. Children have no more patience with waiting for a late feast than I do, and are more vocal about it. (Cookies, fruit snacks, and crackers can prevent a lot of misery).
- 4. They are my children, they are not ME. Just because I like embroidery (fighting, sewing, cooking, archery, etc.) doesn't mean they are going to. Conversely, just because I don't like something, doesn't mean they won't.
- 5. Be grateful for the input and assistance from other adults in the SCA. Ultimately, however, it's your child, and your decision, and you have the right to say that to the well-meaning other adult.
- 6. Make sure that the critical bear (blanket, pillow, whatever, is IN the car, before you leave for Lilies. Also, make sure it's in the car before you LEAVE Lilies.
- 7. Balls, stick ponies, tops, pull toys, puppets, and dolls were just as popular with medieval children as they are with modern ones. Having medieval toys will make the kids feel as though they, too, are part of the game.
- 8. Be aware of what you say. Don't say anything about your fellow SCA people that you wouldn't want said to their faces. That toddler will remember what you said. And repeat it.
- 9. SCA people have interesting school conferences.
- 10. Following a child around at an event, and seeing where his/her curiosity will take you, can give you an amazingly fresh view of the SCA.

Teens:

- 1. There is NO reason to be bored at an event. Help teens understand, however, that sometimes, fun shows up dressed as work.
- 2. When they're older, no one will remember the dozens of times your two-year-old was an angel. What they'll remember is the ONE time s/he (insert infraction here). Oh, well. That's life.
- 3. Teenagers need time to go off and BE teenagers together. If you've done your job as a parent, don't worry about what they're doing. Let them go, relax, and enjoy the feeling of accomplishment, that you've already taught them what's right and what's wrong.
- 4. There comes a point where you have to stop volun-telling them for things. When someone ask you if your teen will do something, the appropriate answer is, "I don't knowask them."
- 5. Remember that many of US weren't much older than our offspring, when we joined the SCA. All by ourselves. Just because we knew them when they were still in diapers, doesn't mean they are still kids.
- 6. Our teens will occasionally make mistakes. Just like we did. Try to temper reaction with the remembrance that we did many of the same things.


This is an opportunity for anyone who has an interest in learning and performing some of the best music of the middle ages and the Renaissance to participate in these performances.
