

March 30th - August 30th, Chinese Buddhist Art, 10th-15th Centuries, Saint Louis Art Museum. From the website, "In the centuries after Buddhism was introduced to China in the early part of the Han dynasty (AD 25-220), the style of Chinese Buddhist art developed its own unique characteristics. Spanning nearly 600 years—from the Five Dynasties (907-960) to the early part of the Ming Dynasty (1368-1644)—Chinese Buddhist Art, 10th-15th Centuries explores this evolution with rarely exhibited works from the Museum's collection that depict significant Buddhist subjects, including bodhisattvas, arhats, and lotuses. The centerpiece of the exhibition is a wall painting depicting the seated Bodhisava Avalokiteśvara that once decorated a temple hall in northern China during the Five Dynasties period.
